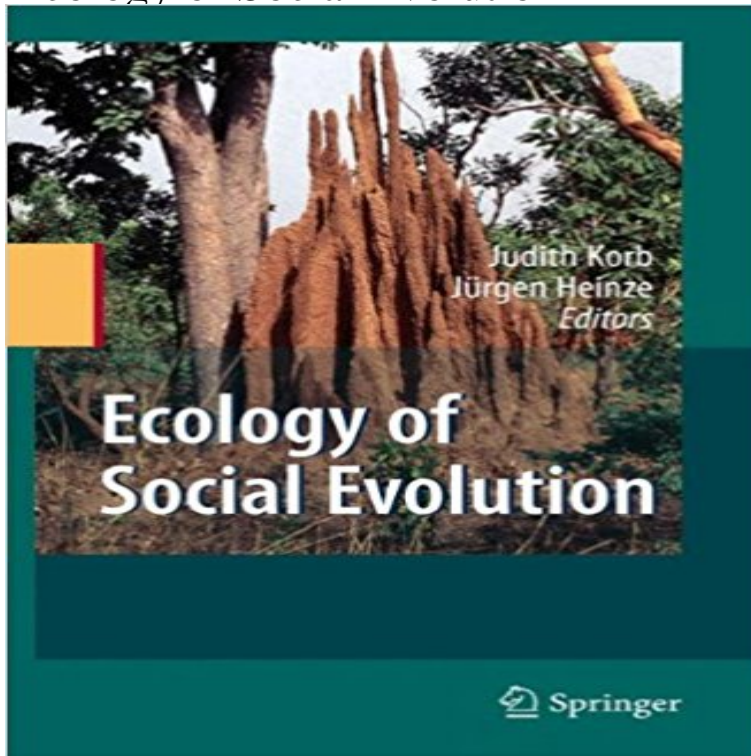


Ecology of Social Evolution
